Plastic Bag Issue and Measures

Issue

LGUs with their bans on plastic bag and polystyrene packaging are being implemented.

Measures

- Use of biodegradable plastic bags as alternative - Philippine National Standards 2097:2014 or the PNS on Plastics Shopping Bags -PNS 2092:2011 on biodegradable plastics.
- Congress has the “Plastic Bag Regulation 2013” bill under deliberation requiring biodegradable plastics compliment the on going recovery and recycling programs of thee industry

Advocacy

- **REGULATION & Responsible Use through 3R and **NOT BANNING****
- **Anti-Littering & Waste Segregation Campaign**
- **Focus on Resource Recovery for RECYCLING in line with RA9003**
- **Accredit Junk Shop/Recyclables dealers & require them to accept no or low value recyclables (CONSOLIDATED SALE)**
- **Integration of Solid Waste in Curricula**
- **Private-Public Sector Initiative for IEC**
- **Increased Gov't. – Private – NGO linkages & partnership for concrete programs**
